PNC appoints regional president

DAYTON — PNC Bank has appointed David Melin as regional president of the Dayton region, effective this Monday. He succeeds Jim Hoehn, who was named regional president of PNC's Central Pennsylvania region after successfully leading the Dayton region for eight years.

A 21-year banking veteran, Melin previously served as city executive and senior vice president of commercial banking in Dayton for Fifth Third Bank. At PNC, Melin will lead the bank's efforts to grow and serve customers in Dayton and drive PNC's community efforts.

"I look forward to assuming Jim's leadership of the PNC team and their commitment to help individual and busi-

ness customers in Dayton achieve their financial goals," Melin said. "We also will continue to make investments to strengthen this community, including the underserved toddlers we support through our PNC Grow Up Great 'Passport to Kindergarten' program."

Hoehn, who has 25 years of banking experience, will support the transition for PNC employees, customers and community contacts during the next few months. His role in Central Pennsylvania was announced in October as he succeeds Denny Brenckle upon his retirement after a 40-year career with PNC.

"Dave's leadership in Dayton will enable us to maintain the momentum established by Jim and the PNC team," said

Pete Classen, executive vice president and head of PNC's office of regional presidents. "Our business model empowers Dave to drive the decisions and investments that support our employees, customers and communities in the region."

Melin was named Fifth Third's Dayton city executive in January 2009 after leading the middle market commercial division across 14 Western Ohio counties and serving as national sales manager for the large corporate commercial team.

The University of Cincinnati graduate plays a leadership role in numerous business and community organizations, including the Dayton Business Committee and Dayton Development Coalition. He is

also a past advisor on the University of Dayton (UD) President's Counsel and the Miami Valley Venture Association. Additionally, Melin has volunteered as a mentor for UD School of Entrepreneurship students.
